Talking to Different People About Jesus

There are many different people in this world. They have many different ideas on how to come to God. Some people do not understand how they can come to God. Some people do not really want to come to God. They have excuses.

When we want to talk to someone about Jesus, we should remember one rule: "Talk to God, then talk to people." We should ask the Lord to give us the right words to say. We should ask the Lord to overcome the problems people have.

Sometimes it is hard to know if a person has a problem or if he is using an excuse.

1. Some problems people have:

1) A person says, "I don't care."

First, we should find out how we can make friends with this person or how we can help this person. This person must see that we care about him. We must never do sinful things to be his friend.

Example

What was Paul willing to do to tell some people about Jesus Christ? 1 Corinthians 9:19-23

Example

Abe was a farmer and a hunter. He never went to church. He was strong and rough. Everyone called him, "Big Abe."

The minister wanted to talk to Abe about Jesus. One day, in winter, the minister went to visit Abe in his home. Abe was shovelling snow off the barn roof. Abe did not want to talk to the minister. He stayed on the roof.

Abe said, "Have to shovel the snow off. It's too heavy for the roof."

The minister said, "Yes, sometimes we have to get a load off." Then the minister took another shovel and climbed onto the roof. He helped shovel the snow off the roof.

At noon, Abe said, "Maybe you should eat with us."

After the meal, the minister said, "Abe, you know why I came to see you."

That day Abe and his wife both came to Jesus. Because the minister helped Abe with the snow, he could talk to Abe about Jesus.

* * * * *

When the person is ready to listen, we can tell him what Christ did for us. (If we are not really happy in the Lord, he will not believe us.)

We can tell the person how Jesus Christ took our burden of sin (Matthew 11:28,29).

We can tell him how Jesus Christ takes care of us (Philippians 4:19).

We can tell him how God answers our prayers (John 15:7).

We can tell how Jesus Christ gives us real joy (John 16:24).

Then we can encourage the person to come to Jesus Christ and to find peace (2 Corinthians 5:18-21; Romans 5:1; John 16:33; Romans 8:1).

2) A person says, "I am good enough."

Show this person that no one is righteous before God. People can look good to other people, but they will not be good enough to please God (Isaiah 64:6; Romans 3:10,23; 1 Corinthians 6:9-11; Galatians 5:19-21; James 2:10; Revelation 21:8; 1 John 1:8).

Show this person what God wants us to be like (1 Peter 1:16; Ephesians 1:4; 5:27; 2 Corinthians 7:1).

Show this person that salvation is by faith and not by the works we do (Ephesians 2:8,9; Titus 3:5,6).

Example

A Pharisee went to the temple to pray. He told God how good he was. He did not ask God for anything. Jesus said that he was not forgiven (Luke 18:10-14).

3) A person says, "I am too bad."

Show this person that his greatest sin is not to believe (Mark 16:16; John 3:18,36).

Tell this person that Jesus died for all sinners (2 Peter 3:9; John 3:16; Romans 5:8; Romans 10:13; 1 Timothy 2:4).

Example

Paul was a Pharisee. At first he believed the Christians were wrong. Paul was the leader when the people stoned Stephen (Acts 7:54-8:1).

Jesus forgave Paul. Later Paul said,

"Here is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance:
Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners - of whom I
am the worst."

Timothy 1:15

4) A person says, "I can't keep on being a Christian."

Many people are afraid they will go back into sin. It is true that some people do go back into sin. This is because they do not know the Word of God and the promises of God.

Tell this person that God keeps us. God wants us to trust Him to keep us. We are like a little child who puts his hand into his father's hand. The father holds on to the child.



"Who through faith are shielded by God's power until the coming of the salvation that is ready to be revealed in the last time."

1 Peter 1:5

Some verses we can use are: John 10:28,29; Hebrews 7:25; 1 Peter 1:5; 1 John 4:4; 1 Corinthians 10:13; 1 John 5:4,5; Jude 24; 1 John 1:9; Philippians 1:6.

5) A person says, "I do not feel saved."

Tell this person that he cannot trust his feelings. Feelings change very quickly. When we are well, and things go well, we are happy. When we are sick or the weather is bad, we can feel sad. When things are hard, we can feel sad.

Tell this person he can trust God's Word. God's Word says.

I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God so that you may know that you have eternal life.

1 John 5:13

God does not change and He cannot lie.

Some verses we can use are: 1 John 5:12,13; Mark 16:16; John 1:12; John 3:16,17; Romans 1:16; 1 John 1:9; John 6:37; Ephesians 2:8,9.

A man said, "God said it. I believe it. That settles it."

6) A person says, "My heart is hard and cold."

Tell this person that God will give him a new heart (Ezekiel 36:26,27; 2 Corinthians 5:17,21).

Tell this person to believe on the Lord Jesus. Jesus will prove that He gives a new heart.

Verses we can use are: Acts 16:31; John 1:12; Acts 2:38,39; Acts 3:19; Romans 10:9,10.

Example

A woman had a cold and hard heart. She did not come to hear the Word of God. She was just like cold and hard ice in winter.

Her husband died. Then she let God change her heart.

Later this woman said, "I really opened my heart to God. I knew there was something more in this life than I had. I have never forgotten God since." There were tears in her eyes. God had given her a new heart that was soft.

7) A person says, "I have sinned away my chance to be saved."

The person who has sinned away his chance to be saved was at one time convicted of his sin by the Holy Spirit. He did not repent. He told the Holy Spirit to go away and leave him alone. When we meet a person like this, it is like talking to a dead person. A person who has sinned away his chance to be saved cannot repent. The Holy Spirit does not speak to him anymore. Read Matthew 12:31,32.

A person who says, "I have sinned away my chance to be saved" and is still sorry about his sin, has not sinned away his chance to be saved. We know this because the Holy Spirit is still speaking to him.

Tell this person that God wants to save everyone (2 Peter 3:9). If this person repents and calls to God, God will hear him (Romans 10:13).

Example

Peter said three times, "I do not know Jesus." But Peter knew he had told a lie and repented. He went and cried bitterly. Jesus forgave him.

Judas betrayed Jesus. Judas knew he had betrayed innocent blood. But Judas went and hanged himself.

When a person really repents, God will forgive him.

8) A person says, "I cannot believe."

We can tell this person that to believe is not only saying, "I believe something." To believe is to trust that Jesus took our place, and to trust in nothing else to make us right with God. When we believe, we do not doubt. We know it is true because God said it.

Example


Sam wants to go in an airplane. If he trusts the plane, he gets into the plane. He believes the plane will take him where he wants to go. Sam shows he has faith when he gets into the plane.

When we put our trust in Jesus to save us, we show we believe.


2. Excuses of people who are weak and afraid

1) "I will have to give up too much."

Matthew 6:33; Mark 8:36-38; 1 John 2:15-17.



2) "My friends and relatives will make fun of me."




Maybe some of your friends and relatives will laugh at you. However, when you live for the Lord, they will want what you have (Matthew 5:10-12).

Matthew 10:36-38; John 15:18-20; Philippians 4:13; Hebrews 12:1,2; Romans 8:18.

3) "I am afraid I cannot forgive my enemies."

Matthew 6:14,15; Matthew 18:21-35; Luke 17:1-5; Ephesians 4:32; Philippians 4:13; Colossians 3:13.



4) "There are some sins I cannot give up."



Confess these sins to God. Ask Him to take them away. Romans 6:11; 2 Corinthians 5:17,21; Romans 8:1-5; Romans 8:12,13; Colossians 3:2,3; Titus 2:11-13; 1 John 1:9.


"Let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles." Hebrews 12:1

5) "There are too many churches. How can I know which is the right one?"

A church cannot save you. Only Jesus Christ can make you right with God. John 3:19-21; John 14:6; John 7:16,17; Acts 4:12; 1 Timothy 2:5.




6) "There are too many hypocrites in the church."




Every man has to speak to God for himself. God will punish the hypocrites (Luke 17:1; Romans 2:1-5; Romans 14:12).

3. Excuses of those who are deceived





The best answer is that God says the Bible is His Word. Most people who say that the Bible is not the Word of God want to have an excuse for the way they live.


