


LESSON 11

MARK 3:13-30




Have you ever thought about how important **WHEELS** are? We need them for wagons, cars, trucks, airplanes, trains, and for machines to make our foods, clothing, houses, bridges, - almost everything. There are little wheels in our clocks and watches. What would the world do without wheels?

Christians are even more important to the world than wheels. We can think of Christianity as being something like a wheel. The outer part, or rim of the wheel, is the part that goes on the ground. The whole world is full of people. Many people are not in touch with Christ. They do not know Jesus as their Savior.

The center or the hub of the heel is the most important part. If there is no hub, we cannot steer, or have any power to go. We can think of Jesus as the center, or hub of the wheel. He wants His Word to get to all the people in the world. He needs men to spread the Gospel, so the people of the whole world can be saved. (John 3:16; Mark 16:15). The spokes of the wheel connect the rim with the hub. The people of the world need to be brought in touch with the hub, Jesus. That is the work Jesus gave His

disciples to do. That is what God wants us to do today.

In verses 14 and 15, it tells us that Jesus sent the disciples out to do three things. Jesus gave them enough of His own power so that they could do these three things. What did He send them out to do?

 - c. "How can Satan cast out Satan?"


4. Check the right box for the right answer.

The devil himself did that in Matthew 4:6.


6. In verse 27, what would you have to do first if you wanted to steal a strong man's house and his things
