## MARK 5:21-43

#### **READ MARK 5:24-34**

When Jesus was on His way to the house of Jairus everybody wanted to come with Him to see what He would do. Many of these people did not believe in Jesus. They just came to see.

There was somebody in the crowd who did believe Jesus.

- 1. Who believed Jesus in verse 24?
- Why did the woman push her way through the crowd to come near Jesus? (verse 28)

- 3. How long had the woman been sick? (verse 25)

This woman was poor in money, but she was rich in faith.


When we have faith in the Lord Jesus, we become sons and daughters of God
