

LESSON 21

MARK 6:31-44

Jesus had sent the disciples out to preach the Gospel. In chapter 6, verses 30 and 31, we are told that the disciples had just come back. Now they tell Jesus all they had done and taught. Jesus had given them all the spiritual food they needed to feed people who were hungry for God's Word. Today's lesson teaches us something else about food.

It was good that at least four of Jesus' followers were fishermen and knew how to row a boat, or use a sail.

When Jesus calls us to follow Him, He lets us serve Him with the things we know how to do. The disciples' boats found a new use. Jesus does not expect us to use what we do not have. Jesus asks us



to serve Him with what we have. If we have a car, or a pickup, we can take people to church with it, or we can take a sick person to the doctor. If we are able to read we can help someone who cannot read. We can read the Bible to him.

When Moses did not think he could do what God told Him to do, God said to Moses.

"What is that in your hand?"

Moses said, "It is a rod." What Moses had in his hand was only the stick he used in taking care of the sheep. When Moses did what God told him to do with it, God did miracles with that same rod, or stick. (Read Exodus 14:16,21,22.)

Sometimes a mother thinks she is not serving the Lord. She is only washing, and scrubbing and mending, or working on hides for moccasins, and bringing up children and cooking and, and, and... But if she gives herself and the things she does in a day to the Lord, God will use her and those things. God will put a prayer in her heart and a song on her lips to praise Him. This is serving the Lord too.

SHEEP AND SHEPHERDS

Mountain sheep in the Yukon can take care of themselves. Farm sheep, kept for their wool and their meat are stupid. They need someone to take care of them. Many animals and birds can find their way home, even a long ways. But sheep do not know which way is home. They cannot fight a wild animal, so they are never safe when they are lost. If



sheep have nobody to take care of them, they could not last long in wild country. Jesus often talks about sheep and the shepherd. The shepherd takes care of sheep. In Isaiah 53:6, God says we are like sheep. He says, "All we, like sheep have gone astray (got lost); we have turned every one to his own way, and the Lord hath laid on Him (our good Shepherd) the sin of us all."





