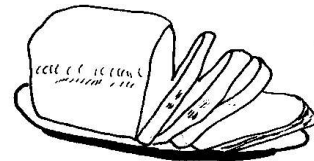
After Jesus had talked about divorce, He talked about children.

READ MARK 10:13-16

JESUS LOVES THE CHILDREN



1. Why did the mothers and fathers bring their little children and babies to Jesus? (verse 13)

7. To receive means to take as a gift. When a mother gives a little child a piece of bread, he takes it. The little child does not have to know how to make bread. He does not have to know what bread is made from. He does not have to know



how hot the oven has to be to bake bread. All the child has to do is to take the bread and eat it. He does not even ask if it good for him. The child receives and eats the bread because his mother gives it to him. It must be good for him. He takes it by faith. He believes in his mother. The child trusts his mother. This is how Jesus says we must receive the kingdom of God. Just as the little child takes bread from his mother by simple faith, trust, and belief, so we receive the kingdom of God. As we take the Lord Jesus into our hearts and lives, God causes us to be born into His kingdom. Then the kingdom of God is in us, and we are in the kingdom of God.

Jesus showed the rich young ruler that even if he thought he was good, there was sin in his heart. He loved his riches more than he loved Jesus.

Jesus showed the young ruler that He did not want him to **DO some more things**. Jesus showed him that he must **GIVE something**. Jesus told the rich young ruler to give away his riches. But Jesus knew that he would not give away his riches unless he first gave . to Jesus. He needed to believe Jesus enough to give himself and all he had to Jesus.

It is good to look into our hearts to see if there is anything that we love more than

we love Jesus. Is there any sin in our lives we would rather keep than to have **treasure in heaven** and **eternal life**?
