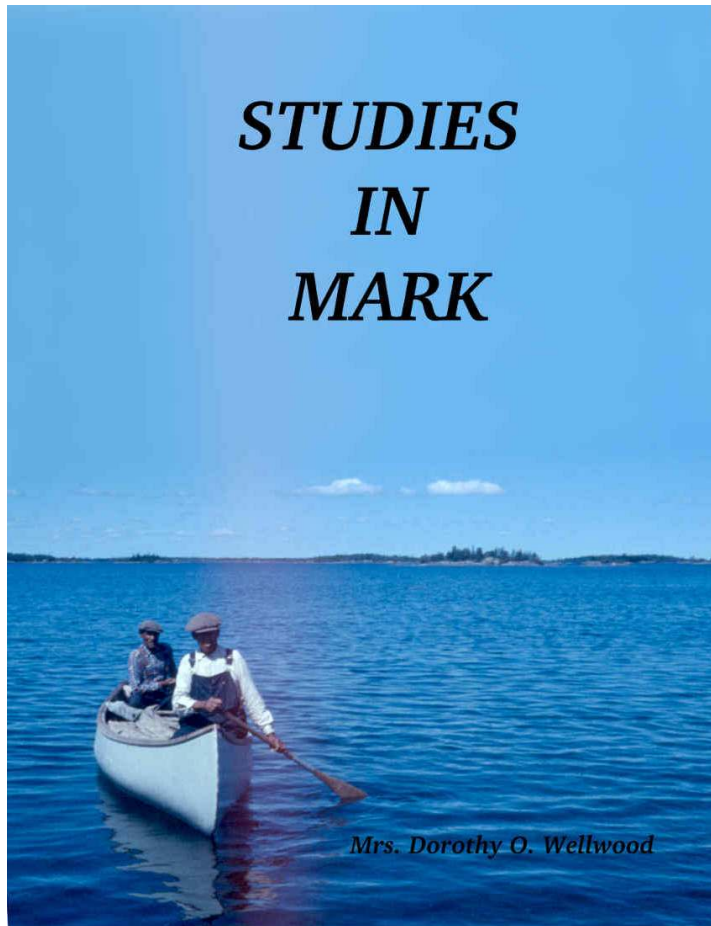

In verse 29, Jesus talks about what He asks us to **leave behind**. He may not always ask us to leave all these things, but He does ask us to be willing to leave all these things.

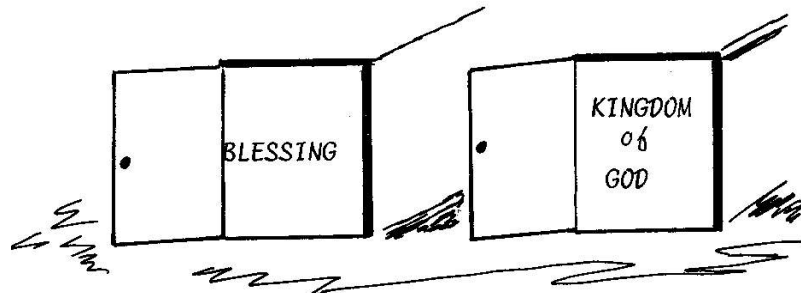
In verse 30, Jesus talks about what **He will give us** if we obey Him. Many missionaries have left all these things behind so they could go and tell others about Jesus, and the Gospel. When God asks us to do something for Him, He does not want us to MAKE EXCUSES. He does not want us to say, "I'll do what you want me to do tomorrow, Lord. He does not want us to say, I'll go to church next Sunday; I want to go fishing today, or I want to do my work today." God does not want EXCUSES instead of OBEYING.

There are so many ways we can put Jesus FIRST, leave our own things and follow Him. He will never ask us to do the wrong thing. We can never lose by leaving all to follow Jesus. We can trust Jesus always.

5. In verse 17 to 22 Jesus talked about a man who was important in Israel. He was YOUNG. He was RICH. He was a Ruler. He was trying to be GOOD. People looked up to him, and thought he was great.
