

King David had been dead for hundreds of years. David was Israel's greatest king. God gave King David a wonderful promise, "Some day another King would come from the family of David." This king would be greater than King David ever was. This King would rule God's people FOREVER. KING David was very happy when God told him this. All Israel knew that what God said would come true. When this King would be born, He would be their Messiah.

The people made a mistake. They thought that the great King whom God would send was coming to save them from all their troubles on earth. They expected that He would save them from all their enemies. They did not understand that the first time Jesus came, it was to save them from their sins.

 King David himself wrote about God's promised Messiah in Psalm 110. READ Psalm 110. How did David know what to write so long before it happened? (Mark 12:36)

(A woman whose husband has died is called a widow.)




5. The poor widow threw in (2 cents, 2 collars, 2 mites).

The poor woman had put in all the money she had. She gave it all to God. In Jesus' eyes her little gift was worth more than all the rich people gave.

It is like that when we give our lives to

Jesus. Some people keep back a little of their lives for themselves. Sometimes we see people who give Jesus all they have. They give their whole lives to Jesus. Jesus is looking for people who are willing to trust their whole lives to Him. They are the ones who are really rich in God.

How rich are we in God's eyes? How much of our lives are we willing to give to our Lord? How much has He given for us? These are good questions to ask ourselves. Sometimes we sing: I want more of Jesus More and more and more. I want more of Jesus Than I've ever had before.
