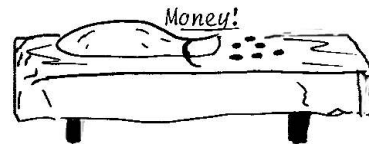

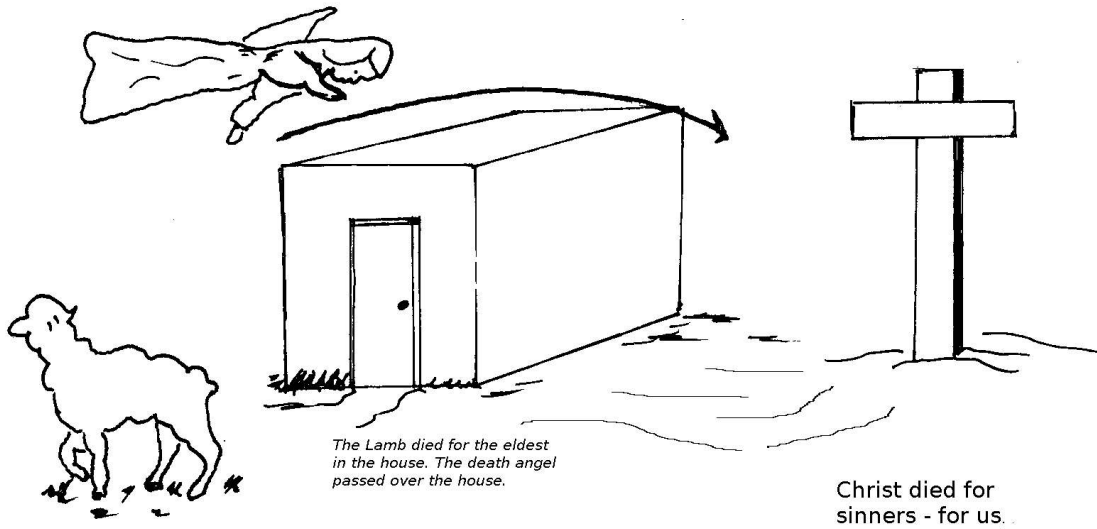
JUDAS BETRAYS THE LORD JESUS

READ MARK 14:12-16

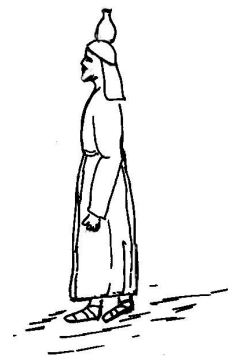


PREPARING FOR THE PASSOVER FEAST

Jesus and His disciples wanted to get ready for the passover feast. God had commanded all Jews to keep this feast to remember how Moses led them out of Egypt. They remembered how the blood on the door had saved their first-born from death. (READ Exodus 12:13.)

Jesus would soon shed His own blood. This would save us from hell and make us free from being slaves to sin and Satan.

They were to follow him. The disciples would be sure to notice a man carrying water. Usually men did not carry water. Carrying water was the work of women.

7. What was the room like (verse 15)

The disciple did what Jesus told them. They found the man. They saw the room where they could have the passover supper. At once they started to get the supper ready. (verse 16) How glad they must have been to find the room all ready for them. This man must have been one of the friends of Jesus. Jesus was welcome to come in and use his house. It is good when Jesus is welcome in our house. Then we can have good meetings in our house.

First the disciples had to kill a lamb for the supper. They also prepared bread made without yeast, some greens, butter, grape juice, and stewed fruit.

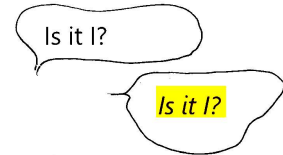
THE PASSOVER FEAST

1. The feast was all ready. When did Jesus and the other disciples come to eat the passover supper? (verse 17)

(It was not safe for Jesus to enter Jerusalem before dark. His enemies were watching for Him. They had plans to kill Him. Jesus was not afraid of His enemies. He was not afraid to die. But He would not give them a chance to kill Him before the hour God planned for Him to die for the sins of the world.)

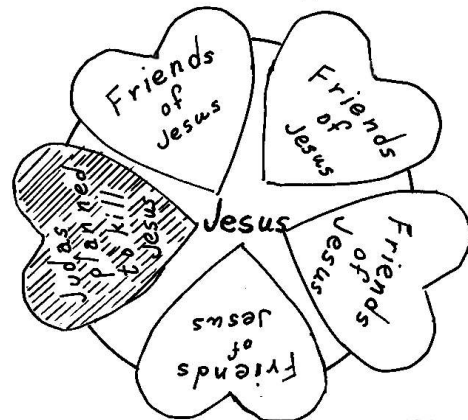
3. Did the disciples know which one of them would betray Jesus? (verse 19)



4. The disciples felt very sad. They wondered who would betray their dear Master to His enemies. They seemed to trust each other. They did not say, “Is it Peter?” “Is it James?” “Is it Judas?” What did they really ask Jesus? (verse 19) “ _____ ?”

5. Jesus did not clearly answer their question. He simply told them that it was one of the twelve. So it had to be one of them. Jesus said, “It is one of the twelve that _____ the dish.”

The dish would be a bowl of stewed fruit. They ate the fruit by all dipping their pieces of bread into the bowl and eating the bread and fruit. This



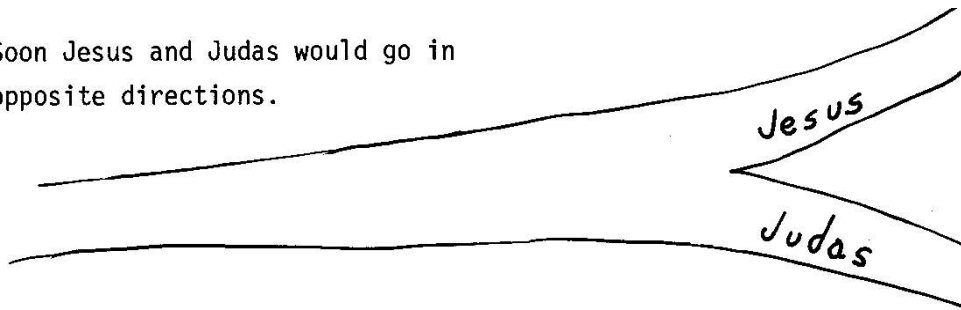
was a love feast. It was the very closest fellowship. All ate from the same loaf of bread. They all drank from the same cup. They all dipped their bread in the same bowl for fruit. (1 Corinthians 10:16,17)

Jesus knew that Judas was the one who would betray Him to His enemies. Judas knew that He was the one. He knew the wicked plans in his heart, and how he was going to betray Jesus.

Judas was the worst hypocrite in history. He sat in the inner circle eating the passover. He was one of the inner circle with Jesus. At the same time he planned to help Jesus' enemies to kill Jesus. He would betray Jesus that very same night.

It does **not** say that Judas went to heaven. He had given himself over to the devil to be used by him.

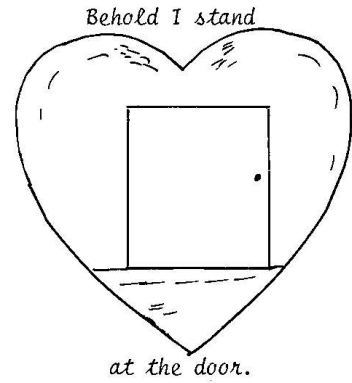
- d. John 13:26,27 tells us who really was behind Judas. Verse 27 says,
