JESUS AND HIS DISCIPLES


Have your ever wondered if Jesus sang?

- 2. Where did Jesus and the disciples go after that?
- 3. Jesus was alone with the eleven disciples. Judas went away to keep his awful bargain with the chief priests. Judas would lead Jesus' enemies to the Mount of Olives. He knew where Jesus would be.

Jesus knew that Judas would betray Him to His enemies. Jesus warned His disciples that a prophecy would be fulfilled.



"All ye shall be because

this night." (The word "offended" here seems to mean that they would all turn away from Him.)

4. Hundreds of years ago the prophet Zechariah had written about Jesus' death.

READ Zechariah 13:7. The prophet said: (Mark 14:27)

"I will (kill) the and the shall be ."

Sheep cannot take care of themselves. When they have no shepherd to care for them, they go away in all directions. Sheep cannot find their way home. They get lost easily. Jesus told His disciples the same words that the prophet had said. He told them that the Shepherd would be killed and the sheep would be scattered.

- 5. Jesus told the disciples more. He knew they would be all upset because their leader would be killed. They all thought that Jesus would make Himself a king right away. Perhaps even Judas thought that Jesus would get away from His enemies. He always had escaped before. But Jesus had told them that He would be killed for sure. Jesus also told them some good news after that. What did He tell them in verse 28?

- 6. One of the disciples thought he was very brave. He told Jesus that if everyone else would leave Him, he never would do that. Which disciple said that? (verse 29)
- 7. Jesus told this disciple that he would deny Him that very night. Jesus said to him, (verse 30)

"Verily I say unto thee, , even before the twice

(two times) thou shalt Me thrice (three times.)"

The cock is a rooster. A rooster crows (makes a loud noise) very early in the



morning, when it starts to get light. On a farm where they keep hens and roosters, the noise of the rooster crowing will sometimes wake people up. When the rooster would crow that night, it would wake Peter up to know he was not as brave as he thought. Jesus told Peter that he would deny his Lord three time.

What does it mean to deny someone?

DENY means to say "no."

If someone said to Peter, "You are a disciple of Jesus," he would say, "No, I never knew Him."

DENY "I do not know Him."

"But Peter, I have seen you with Jesus." Peter would say, "No, I never knew Him."

"But Peter, I have seen you with Jesus." Peter would say, "No, you are wrong. He is no friend of mine. I don't know Him at all." This is what it means when Jesus told Peter that he would **deny** Him.

If someone said to us, "Ah, you are a Christian," we might be ashamed and say, "No, I am not a Christian at all." If we did that, we would deny Christ.

8. When Jesus told Peter that he would deny Him, Peter spoke very loudly.
What did Peter say in verse 31?

"If I should , I will not in any ." (way)

- 9. How many of the other disciples said they would never deny Jesus?
- 10. Peter and the rest were too sure of themselves. Jesus knew them better than they knew themselves. Does Jesus know us better than we know ourselves?
 . We should never think we can keep ourselves true to the Lord. We need to trust Jesus to keep us every step of the way. Peter had to learn that lesson too.

READ MARK 14:32-34


JESUS IN GETHSEMANE
